P: My heart is full of joy and contentment.


- C: My mouth is filled with praises for You.

- C: For in Him the world had its beginning, and each day is begun by His governance.

- C: For in Him a new age began, a new life was given, and a new hope rose out of death.

- C: For in Him we are called, gathered, enlightened, sanctified and sent.
- P: And so we begin, for God is the Lord of new beginnings:
- C: Beginning with us! Thanks be to God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit!

The Sermon: Matthew 26:69-75, "The Fruit of the Spirit is Self-Control"

The Offering

The Responsive Prayer for Self-Control

P: How often, O Lord, our lives are out of control. Temptations stand in our way, and we lose self-control, for, as St. James says, "Each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire.

C: Then desire when it has conceived gives birth to sin; and sin when it is full-grown brings forth death."

P: Our tongues speak before we think; our tongues speak what we think; our tongues speak what should not be spoken; we lose self-control.

C: "The tongue is a fire. The tongue is an

unrighteous world among our members, staining the whole body, sets the whole course of one's life on fire, and is itself set on fire by hell.

- P: All kinds of animals, birds, reptiles and sea creatures are being tamed and have been tamed by mankind,
- C: But no human being can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison.
- P: With it we bless the Lord and Father, and with it we curse men, who are made in the likeness of God.
- C: From the same mouth come blessing and cursing." Lord, give to us the spirit of self-control.
- P: Like Peter, we think we are in control, O Lord. We imagine that because we are Your followers, we can stand on our own.
- C: We think that we will not be the one who will lose our tempers, say the hurting word, do the thoughtless, uncontrolled action.
- P: And then we are out of control. Things, relationships, standards, values, all fall apart.
- C: And we end up in a heap, weeping from inside out, biting our tongues, filled with shame and regret.
- P: Look on us, Lord. Take control. Real control, Lord, the control that King David's out-of-control life pleaded for when he prayed:
- C: "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and

renew a right spirit within me."

P: Look on us, Lord. Take control.

C: "Cast me now away from Your presence and take not Your Holy Spirit from me."

P: Look on us, Lord. Take control, we are not in control. We desire You to be in control of us.

C: Take control of me, O Lord. Give to us the Spirit's gift of self- control. And then our hearts and minds and tongues and lives will sing in uncontrolled, Spirit-controlled praise to You:

ALL: "Restore to me the joy of Your salvation; and uphold me with Your free Spirit."
